

aerospace education for the Oklahoma teachers and students. Legislation in 1976 included the Commission as part of the Department of Transportation but stipulated that its powers and duties remain as previously defined by the Statutes. When the Commission was authorized in 1963 there were 143 airports. The number has now increased to 292 as of June 30, 1982. The Commission also furnishes a Directory of Oklahoma Airports, the Oklahoma Aeronautical Chart and wind socks for aviation safety in Oklahoma.

History and Function—The Board of Public Affairs was created in 1909, consisting of three members no more than two of which may be of the same party. In 1983, this agency was changed by Senate Bill 305 to Office of Public Affairs with one Director and one Deputy Director.

The Board has the following support and service responsibilities for all state agencies: (1) Central Purchasing (2) Engineering & Architectural (3) Motor Pool (4) Central Printing (5) Communications Coordination (6) State Agency for Surplus Property (7) Management of Inventory and Property (8) "Central Information Office for State Lands" (Oil, gas land and agricultural leases, easements, right-of-way and sales for Capitol Complex and eleemosynary lands).

Other divisions relating primarily to the State Capitol Complex are: (1) Physical Plant and Director of Properties (2) Management of Capitol and Sequoyah Cafeterias (3) Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District (4) Tour Guides.

Oklahoma Community Social Service Center Authority

(The State Board of Public Affairs is designated as the supervisory agency for the Authority. Under legislative enactment in 1967, formation of trusts for the construction of facilities to house social service agencies into one central building was authorized with cities, counties and the State permitted to participate. Such a center was constructed at Ada under this law with the East Central Oklahoma Building Authority Trust serving as fiscal agent for the City of Ada, Pontotoc County and the State in the venture.)
