**History and Function**—The Board was established by the Legislature in 1925 and is responsible for the examination and licensing of architects after determining their eligibility. **History and Function**—The Committee consists of five members from each of the states of Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado and Missouri, appointed by the respective governors to represent their states in the task of developing water resources. The committee is an outgrowth of cooperation started between Arkansas and Oklahoma in 1945 on the Arkansas River multi-purpose plan. The Committee's principal task is presentation of testimony annually to Congress on appropriations for water resource projects.

**ARKANSAS-WHITE-RED RIVER BASINS INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE**

**History and Function**—The Committee was organized in 1950 at the direction of the President of the United States in an effort to achieve a more orderly development of the basins of three rivers among the states of Arkansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado and Texas. The governors of these states then appointed representatives to the Committee. Representatives of numerous federal agencies also serve on the Committee.
