do hereby make application to the Board of Pension Commissioners for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the Fifth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma, and approved February, 25, 1915, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; that I was honorably discharged or surrendered Disbanded at Greensborough North Carolina.
at the end of the war.

and I have been a bona fide citizen of this State for over twelve months prior to the passage and approval of the Pension Act, approved February 25, 1915. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$180.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment, nor do I receive from any source whatsoever, money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$180.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over One Thousand Dollars, household goods and wearing apparel exeluded, nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State or from any other source. and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, or any other benevolent or penal institution, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:





Mr. Cullom has only \$9.59 in the bank when he dies.

Will you please pardon the delay, which was unavoidable, in replying to your letter of February 24th, with reference to the pension application of the widow of Mr. Harvey E. Cullom?

We have noted Mr. Cullom's death on February 4th; in fact, we had done so even before your letter came, as we had seen an account of this death in a copy of the Ardmoreite. Now we have filed the widow's application, and will enroll her as a pensioner beginning April 1st.

The pension warrant covering the claim which Mr. Cullom had signed for this present quarter will be issued and forwarded to Mrs. Cullom with instructions as to cashing, and the amount may be applied on funeral and medical expenses. If the Legislature does not appropriate funds for this next payment within the next few days we will be late in sending out the warrants; otherwise, they will be sent out on April 1st. I do not know that they will be in the full amount of \$120.00 each; that depends upon the action of the Legislature, but Mrs. Cullom will receive a payment of some sort and can so advise the undertakers.

We feel badly about losing Mr. Cullom; his name had been on our roll such a long time. Mrs. Cullom and all others of the family have our deep sympathy, and will you kindly so tell them?
