What You Need:

- Paper plate, any color
- Yarn, any color
- Hole punch
- Plastic spider, any color



What To Do:

- Punch about 12 holes around the edges of your paper plate with the hole punch.
- Take your yarn and thread through the holes. Going from one side to the other.
- Keep crisscrossing the yarn until you are happy with the look. Then tie the ends.
- Add a plastic spider for that special touch!
